Who is eligible?

Anyone age 17 or over who is not presently enrolled in a secondary school is welcome to enroll. Flexible, self-paced, individualized instruction for reading, writing, and math skills, along with preparation for the GED®, Adult Diploma, Work Keys, Career Ready 101, and/or ACCUPLACER® tests. (Year-round Classes)

Free TEAS Prep Class

A Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS Test) Prep Course will be offered for students that are going into the Nursing Program (RN or LPN) at ATCC. The registration deadline is Jan. 4, 2018

This class will run for 8 weeks starting January 9 and ends March 1, 2018. Classes will run from 5:30 PM to 8:30 PM on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Call for more information.

Preparatory Math (for health sciences) at ATCC

“Preparatory Math (which has an emphasis in health sciences)” is a sixteen-week course offered at no cost. The registration deadline is Jan. 4, 2018

The Math Prep course will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from January 9 through May 3, 2018, 10:00 AM to 10:55 AM in Room 747.

Topics include decimal numbers, fractions, ratios and proportions, percent and percentage problems, English/metric conversions, calculating area and volume, and basic algebra.

Get back to the basics. This is a great class to improve basic math skills as well as preparing someone to take the Accuplacer, the ATCC entrance exam.

Computer and Writing Skills Class Offered at ATCC

This course is an eight-week course designed to help students update their computer and writing skills.

Early registration is recommended. The registration deadline is February 15, 2018.

Classes will run Mondays and Wednesdays beginning February 26 and ending April 25, 2018. The course will be held from 5:30 PM – 8:30 PM, Room TBD.

The class will focus on computer programs, such as Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and some social media. It will help prepare students for success in the workplace and in ATCC's Intro to Computers class. In addition, basic college writing skills will be covered to help prepare students for future endeavors.
