The MSHSL rule states that physicals are good for 3 years “to the date”. You don’t want your physical to expire 3 years later if you are in a state tournament in June. Those 6<sup>th</sup> graders who had physicals this year to participate on MSHSL teams are good through 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

On Friday, June 14 at Joe Faber Field in the state semifinal round, the boys took on Sacred Heart. Win and we advance to the championship at Target Field Monday, lose and we hang around for a third place game. The boys had no intention of playing two on Friday! After a good round of BP that morning, and crisp round of IO, the boys were amped and ready to work. The Panthers came out swinging, ripping line drives as Debilzen singled, Revering doubled, and Steidl doubled to score both, and in the blink of an eye, we were up 2-0 and the crowd and dugout were frenzied! Boesl then singled to give us runners at the corners, and with the lefty pitcher, and a strong armed catcher, promptly executed a delayed steal to scamper to second for two more men in scoring position. Noska then got jammed on an inside pitch, but had enough to muscle the ball over the shortstops head to score Steidl and put us up 3-0 after our half. On the mound Revering got the start in this one today and was caught by Shane Hanson. The veteran senior came out and attacked the zone, but Sacred Heart has some dangerous hitters, and they were able to start with back to back singles, and even scratch a run across taking advantage of some balls in the dirt. David never got rattled and after the run, promptly induced two fly outs and a strikeout. Back to work in the top of the second, Sacred Heart was able to record two quick outs, but that brought up the top of the lineup and Debilzen said were not ready to go back on defense yet as he ripped a two out double. Debilzen would advance to third on a passed ball and Revering promptly followed that with a sharp single to score Dylan. Chavous Wendt came in to courtesy run for David, and stole second, and was driven in by Steidl as he recorded his second hit of the day. After that Revering and the defense continued to work. David struck out 4, gave up 7 hits, and issued no free passes! Our defense played error free behind him highlighted by a 1-6-3 double play called as the runner going to second interfered with Steidl’s throw to first, and Noska again had a dandy play at third as he charged a ground ball and threw on the run a strike to Mrnak at first. Our outfield shined in the big park as Wagner, Debilzen and Grabow all tracked down fly balls and line drives. The boys continued to battle at the plate and grabbed some insurance runs. Revering led off the 5th with a single and Wendt came in to courtesy run. With the third baseman playing a little far back, Steidl laid down a beautiful bunt. The pitcher tried to make a play and fire down to first, but the throw was wild, and even if it was on target, would not have gotten Steidl. The errant throw allowed Wendt to try for third. As he was sliding into third, the throw got away from whoever threw over and was rolling to the fence. Wendt popped up and headed for home as he was able to slide in safely. Our final run came in the top of the 7th, again we had two outs before Boesl singled, and you guessed it, stole second base. Noska then singled to center to score Boesl and put us up 7-1. The bottom of the 7th was the exclamation mark on a well played game as Revering and the defense shut down Sacred Heart 1-2-3. The Panthers banged out 13 hits in this one with Steidl and Revering each having three, Debilzen,

Boesl and Noska with a pair, and Wagner with a hustle double in the 6th. The Panthers played incredibly well today in every facet of the game. Our dugout and crowd energy has far surpassed any other team down there the past two days. With this win, the 2024 Panthers have earned a trip to the Class A Championship game at Target Field, Monday June 17th vs the Springfield Tigers. Hope to see you there!
